Salt loves to play and is very social with dogs he knows to the point of loving to curl up and share his bed with one of his foster siblings.

Salt does have a reactive insecurity to most unknown people and dogs. He is very suspicious of children. He prefers women typically but not exclusively. Salt needs no-nonsense, gentle but firm guidance. He is eager to please and takes well to corrections. A best fitting home would have another active, rough-play-loving,

very confident dog. Salt can be opportunistic to dogs he perceives as weaker but he does respect any dog who gives him a well deserved canine comeuppance. Salt is fine with cats and has lived with ten of them! He would not do well placed in a home with children or elderly dogs.

Salt does not do well left outside for any duration. He actively craves and seeks stimulation and starts barking. He does love being in his crate and willingly runs in.

Currently, Salt is in my home with several other smooths and mixes. He has two best buds that he subjects to seemingly nonstop neck and leg biting - all in play. He needs a home with someone with more time though to bring him to his potential - to get him out, about and exposed in cautious increments to build his confidence. 
